- 5) Annual Meeting (By-Laws, 2015 Review, 2016 Vision)
  - By-Laws; no changes requested.
  - 2015 Review; Third phase of rate increase began in April. Flushing program became routine, 3 flush valves installed. Water system feasibility study and seismic retrofit project completed. Drought contingency plan updated. CSA7 meter replacement program confirmed completed. County agreed to and began their own meter replacement program. Committee and County partnered to perform ongoing water audits. Watershed sanitary survey completed. Cross connection control program completed. Income survey begun. Achieved marginal TTHM compliance.
  - 2016 Vision; Complete successful income survey. Write and obtain grant funding. Balanced budget; improving income and reducing overhead. Continue to update database and perform pressure readings. Continue flushing program and install further flush valves if budget allows. Quarterly water audits. Functional website. Reliable TTHM compliance. Healthy watershed. An awareness that what goes on our land, goes in the creek, goes in your drinking water.
